CALL FOR MONOGRAPHS

The Publications Committee of the Society has both a publishing arrangement with The Catholic University of America Press and funding available to subsidize the publication of significant scholarly works in medieval or Renaissance philosophy. The Committee especially seeks mature and distinctly philosophical treatments of texts, figures, periods, or problems. Although we wish to encourage young scholars, we will not consider unrevised doctoral dissertations. Since we are looking for philosophical monographs, we will not at the present time consider text editions or translations of Latin texts.

CALL FOR PAPERS

International Conference on Patristic, Medieval, and Renaissance Studies

The XXX Conference on Patristic, Medieval, and Renaissance Studies conference will be held at Villanova University **October 14-16, 2005**, and is sponsored by the Augustinian Historical Institute and the Villanova Department of Philosophy. Abstracts for prospective papers are welcome, as is your initiative in organizing a section. The Conference especially welcomes papers addressing two issues: (a) TYRANNY and (b) JUSTICE. It is hoped that a significant number of these studies will be submitted for publication in a special volume or issue of the *Journal of Patristic, Medieval, and Renaissance Studies*. It is hoped these themes will receive the wide treatment in literature, philosophy, political science, theology, art, etc., which they merit.
